

SCHOOLING/FUN SHOW RULES & INFORMATION

Flat classes in each division will be held in the outdoor ring immediately followed by jumping in the indoor.

1. Fairwinds Farm will not be responsible for any injury done to horse, rider, equipment or spectators, or any theft.
2. The judge's decision will be final.
3. The show committee reserves the right to combine, change, or cancel any classes.
4. Braiding is unnecessary. Informal attire acceptable but hard hats and safe footwear are required.
5. All fence heights are approximate.
6. Martingales are prohibited in all under saddle classes.
7. There will be no refunds for missed classes.
8. There will be an ENFORCED one minute call-up time for all classes.
9. All dogs must be on a leash and no alcoholic beverages allowed.
10. Food will be available on the premises.
11. Schooling will alternate between indoor and outdoor rings all day.

Order of Classes

1. **Welcome Hack** – Judged 50% on rider, 50% on mount. Horses and ponies.

Beginner Child – For riders 17 and under in their first year of showing. May ride horses or ponies.

2. walk – trot
3. walk – trot – canter
4. over fences – 2’0” x-rails.

Beginner Adult – For riders 18 and over in their first year of showing. May ride horses or ponies.

5. walk – trot
6. walk – trot – canter
7. over fences – 2’0” x-rails.

Beginner Pony – 1st or 2nd year of showing

8. walk – trot
9. walk – trot – canter
10. over fences – 2’0” x-rails.

Beginner Horse – 1st or 2nd year of showing

11. walk – trot
12. walk – trot – canter
13. over fences – 2’0” straight rails

Pleasure Pony – Open to ponies. Adults may ride.

14. walk – trot
15. walk – trot – canter
16. over fences – 2’0” straight rails

Thirtysomething – open to all riders 30 or over riding horses or ponies.

17. walk – trot
18. walk – trot – canter
19. over fences – 2’0” straight rails

Jr. Equitation – Riders 17 & under on ponies or horses

20. walk – trot
21. walk – trot – canter
22. over fences – 2’3” straight rails

Pleasure Horse – open to all horses

23. walk – trot
24. walk – trot – canter
25. over fences – 2’3” straight rails

Senior Equitation – For riders 18 years or over on horses or ponies

26. walk – trot
27. walk – trot – canter
28. over fences – 2’6” straight rails

Fun Classes

May ride English or Western, horses or ponies, Fathers & daughters (or sons!)* may participate together in classes 29-32.

29. **Father’s Lead Line** – Daughters*, lead your Dads! Walk only.
30. **Fathers & daughters* Pairs Class** – Pair up with your Dad at the walk only
31. **Break And Out** – Command class
32. **Dollar Bareback** Winner keeps the dollars!
33. **Keyhole Race** – race to the end of the ring and back while staying inside the “keyhole.”
34. **Egg & spoon** – carry the egg to the end of the ring and back while mounted
35. **Sack race** – ride down, jump into your sack and hop back leading your horse.
36. **Obstacle course** – judged on ability to maneuver obstacles.
37. **Pairs Class** – walk, trot, canter and a low X-rail
38. **Pole Bending** – ride through the serpentine of poles and back. Best time wins!
